Live Updates for NTA Exam Calendar 2025: JEE Main, NEET UG, and CUET exam dates, along with the registration link

The National Testing Agency (NTA) is set to release the exam calendar for the 2025 session shortly. This calendar will include crucial exams like JEE Main, NEET UG, and CUET UG. As per previous trends, the Joint Entrance Examination (JEE) Main will be held in two sessions—January and April—while the NEET UG exam is expected to be scheduled for May. The Common University Entrance Test (CUET) UG will likely be conducted in two phases, tentatively in May and June.

Although the exact dates for these exams have not yet been officially announced, candidates can expect the details to be published soon on the NTA's official website, nta.ac.in. Along with the dates, the NTA will also open the registration process for JEE Main 2025, allowing aspiring candidates to submit their application forms online.

In a significant update for JEE Main aspirants, the Ministry of Education has decided to remove the option of selecting only five

questions out of 10 in Section B of the JEE Main 2025 exam, a feature that had been in place since the pandemic as a temporary measure. This change will affect both Paper 1 and Paper 2 of the JEE Main exam. Until 2024, students were given the flexibility to choose which five out of 10 numerical questions they wished to answer, a concession introduced to ease the pressure during COVID-19. However, this option has now been eliminated, and students will be required to answer all numerical questions in Section B from 2025 onwards.

In 2024, CUET UG was conducted between May 15 and 29, NEET UG took place on May 5, and JEE Main was held across two sessions in January and April. As candidates prepare for the upcoming 2025 session, they are advised to keep a close watch on the NTA's announcements and ensure timely registration for their respective exams.

CLAT 2025: Application edit option opens by October 25

The Consortium of National Law Universities (NLU) has opened the application correction window for the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) 2025, providing candidates with the opportunity to make necessary changes to their submitted forms. This window will remain open until October 25, 11:59 pm. Applicants who need to update specific details, including their test location preferences, can do so within this timeframe.

The official website for making any edits or updates to the CLAT 2025 application form is consortiumofnlus.ac.in.

Key Details for Application Corrections:

Candidates are allowed to make changes to several crucial aspects of their application during this period, including:

Test Location Preferences: Modify or update the location where you would prefer to take the CLAT 2025 exam.

Name: Correct any errors or discrepancies in your name.

Date of Birth: Update your date of birth if needed.

Programme Applied: Change your selection between undergraduate (UG) or postgraduate (PG) programs, depending on your preference.

Reservation Eligibility: Update your eligibility for any reservation categories you may qualify for.

Steps to Update Test Location Preferences:

To assist candidates in updating their test location or other details, the following steps should be followed:

Login: Visit the CLAT 2025 official website (consortiumofnlus.ac.in)

and log in using your credentials.

Edit Application: Click on the "Edit Application Form" button available on the dashboard.

Test Centre: Go to the "Test Centre Preferences" section to review and update your preferred exam centers.

Update: Make the necessary changes to your test location preferences.

Reservation: Proceed to the "Reservation" tab by clicking the "Next" button, where you can update reservation details if applicable.

Declaration: Read through the updated information and agree to the declaration at the bottom of the form.

Submit: Once satisfied with the changes, click on the "Submit Form" button to save your edits.

Registration Deadline Reminder:

Candidates who have not yet completed their registration for CLAT 2025 still have time to apply. The application window will close on October 22, 11:59 pm. After this deadline, no new applications will be accepted. The CLAT 2025 exam, which is mandatory for admission to undergraduate and postgraduate law programs across 24 National Law Universities (NLUs) and other prestigious law institutions in India, will be conducted on December 1, 2024.

With the exam date approaching, candidates are encouraged to take advantage of this correction window to ensure all their details are accurate. Making timely corrections will help avoid any complications later in the admission process.

UPSC CDS 1 2024: Final results released on upsc.gov.in

The Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) has announced the final results for the Combined Defence Services (CDS) I 2024 exam on Monday, October 21. Candidates who appeared for the exam can view their results on the official website, upsc.gov.in.

A total of 237 candidates have been recommended for admission to various defense courses, including the Indian Military Academy (IMA), Indian Naval Academy (INA), and Air Force Academy. According to the official list, 158 candidates have qualified for the IMA, 44 for the INA, and 34 for the Air Force Academy.

The UPSC's official notice stated, "The Government has notified 100 vacancies for the Indian Military Academy, including 13 reserved for NCC 'C' Certificate (Army Wing) holders, 32 for the Indian Naval Academy, Ezhimala, Kerala, and 32 for the Air Force Academy, Hyderabad, including 3 vacancies for NCC 'C' Certificate (Naval Wing) holders."

The UPSC further highlighted that 1,954 candidates qualified in the written test for the IMA, 586 for the INA, and 628 for the Air Force Academy. The final qualified candidates were selected after the SSB tests conducted by the respective Army Headquarters.

After the result declaration, candidates must submit their original certificates (for Date of Birth, Educational Qualifications, etc.) along with attested copies to the respective Army, Naval, or Air Headquarters, according to their first preference.

Additionally, UPSC has announced that the marks of the candidates will be made available on the official website after the final results for the Officers' Training Academy (OTA) for CDS I 2024 are declared.

- Click on UPSC CDS I Final Result 2024 link available on the home page.
- A new PDF page will open where candidates can check the roll numbers along with their names.
- Download the page and keep a printout of the same for future reference.

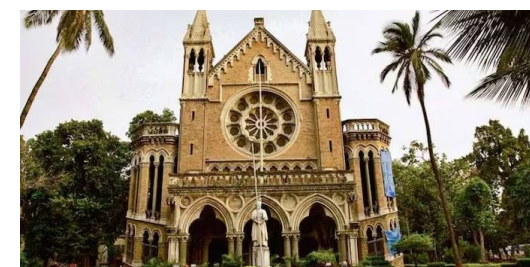


Mumbai University reschedules Winter 2024 law exams, check new dates here.

The University of Mumbai has announced a significant revision in the schedule for its Winter 2024 law examinations. These changes primarily affect students enrolled in affiliated law colleges. The exams that were initially slated to be conducted on December 2, 2024, have now been pushed to January 22, 2025. This shift impacts the first-year students of the LLB/BLS (5-year course), the BA LLB (5-year integrated course), and the first semester LLB/BLS (5-year course), all of whom will now sit for their exams on the rescheduled date in January.

The rescheduling comes in the wake of logistical adjustments due to the upcoming Assembly elections in Maharashtra. As a result, the University of Mumbai has also revised the timetable for several other exams, particularly those for students in online and distance learning programs.



According to the latest notification issued on October 18, exams that were previously planned for November 19 and 20 have been deferred to November 30 and December 7, respectively.

This decision affects a broad range of students and is intended to ensure smoother operations during the election period, minimizing any disruptions to the academic calendar. Students are advised to stay updated with official announcements and keep track of the revised dates to avoid any confusion.
