MHT CET 2025 Latest News and 50% Increase in Women's Higher Education in India: Why Are Engineering and IT Still Missing Out? Update

While the number of women pursuing higher education in India has been steadily increasing, a noticeable imbalance remains between those choosing engineering and technology-related fields and those opting for other areas of study. Data from the Indian government reveals that between the academic years 2013-14 and 2021-22, there was a substantial 46 percent rise in female enrollment in undergraduate programs, and an even more significant 55.5 percent increase in postgraduate programs. However, this overall growth in female participation in higher education is overshadowed by a decline in enrollment in engineering degrees

Specifically, the data indicates a 1.35 percent decrease in women enrolling in undergraduate engineering courses and a much sharper 43 percent drop in postgraduate engineering programs. Looking at other disciplines, female enrollment in undergraduate commerce programs experienced a healthy 42 percent growth

Education Budget 2025-26 Receives Positive Industry Feedback

The recently unveiled Union Budget 2025-26 has garnered praise from Dhruv Galgotia, CEO of Galgotias University, who lauded its commitment to bolstering India's education sector. Galgotia specifically highlighted the government's dedication to transforming India into a global knowledge hub, evidenced by increased budgetary allocations for both school and higher education.

The budget allocates a substantial Rs 128,650 crore to the Ministry of Education. Of this, Rs 78,572 crore has been earmarked for school education, while Rs 50,078 crore will support higher education initiatives. Galgotia emphasized the importance of several key initiatives within the budget, including Atal Tinkering Labs

the PM Research Fellowship Scheme, and the establishment of a Centre of Excellence in Artificial Intelligence. He believes these programs will significantly contribute to enhancing both learning outcomes and research capabilities within the country.

Galgotia also expressed his appreciation for the budget's focus on improving skilling programs and easing financial access to education. He noted that these measures are in close alignment with the goals and objectives outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, suggesting a cohesive and strategic approach to educational reform. The CEO's positive response underscores the budget's potential to drive meaningful change and advancement within India's education landscape.

India's Higher Education Enrolment Makes Gains: Up from 23.7% to 28.4%

The Economic Survey 2024-25 was introduced in Parliament by Nirmala Sitharaman, Union Minister for Finance and Corporate Affairs. According to the Survey, the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP) is founded on the idea that education and the development of human capital are essential to the advancement of the country.

UDISE+ 2023-24 reports that there are 98 lakh teachers and 14.72 lakh schools in India, serving 24.8 crore pupils. Of the total, 69 percent are government institutions, which employ 51 percent of teachers and enroll 50 percent of students. With 32.6 percent of kids enrolled and 38 percent of teachers employed, private schools make up 22.5 percent of the total.

By 2030, NEP 2020 aims to achieve a 100% Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER). With continuous attempts to close gaps at the secondary level (77.4 percent) and higher secondary level (56.2 percent), GER is almost ubiquitous at the primary level (93 percent). At 1.9 percent for primary, 5.2 percent for upper primary, and 14.1 percent for secondary education, school dropout rates have decreased.

Improvements have been made to school facilities, such as improved access to information and communication technologies and improved cleanliness. While internet access climbed from 22.3 percent to 53.9 percent during the same period, the percentage of schools with computers increased from 38.5 percent in 2019-20 to 57.2 percent in 2023-24.

Samagra Shiksha Abhiyan and its sub-schemes, such as NISHTHA, Vidya Pravesh, District Institutes of Education and Training (DIETs), and Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalaya (KGBV), as well as initiatives like DIKSHA, STARS, PARAKH, PM SHRI, ULLAS, and PM POSHAN, are some of the programs and schemes the government is using to implement NEP 2020.

In April 2024, the government introduced the National Framework for Early Childhood Stimulation (Navchetana) and the National Curriculum for ECCE (Aadharshila) in an effort to improve ECCE. Aadharshila offers play-based learning activities for kids ages three to six, while Navchetana uses a 36-month stimulation cycle to help kids from birth to three years old.

Foundational Literacy and Numeracy (FLN) is a top priority for NEP 2020 since it is crucial for learning success. To guarantee that all students achieve FLN by Grade 3 by 2026-2027, the Department of School Education & Literacy launched the National Initiative for Proficiency in Reading with Understanding and Numeracy (NIPUN Bharat). One strategy utilized to accomplish this is peer teaching.

NEP 2020's ECCE program emphasizes socioemotional growth and basic literacy. Social-Emotional Learning (SEL), a strategy for integrating moral and emotional growth into the curriculum, is covered in the survey. With the advent of Industry 4.0, which places a strong emphasis on automation, artificial intelligence, the Internet of Things, big data, and robotics, skill education has become more important. Additionally, digital literacy is being included into the classroom to support students' growth in communication and analysis abilities. The government introduced TeacherApp, a digital professional development platform, to assist educators. Industry-relevant skills and certifications, individualized learning tools, and artificial intelligence (AI) for teacher development and student tutoring are the main areas of concentration for technology integration in education.

As the higher education industry changed, the number of institutions rose from 51,534 in 2014-15 to 58,643 in 2022-23.

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IP University Admissions 2025: Online application begins on February 1- Key details of new courses

IP University Admissions 2025: Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University (GGSIPU) will start the admission registration procedure for the academic session 2025-26 on February 1, as per the notice issued by the varsity. The admissions to several undergraduate, Postgraduate, and PhD courses across the university will be done based on their CUET scores only. Remaining admissions will be conducted by the scores in the University's common entrance test (IPU CET) 2025. The classes will start from August 1, 2025.

Notably, the varsity will conduct the registration procedure for the 46 master's degree, 40 PhD, and 34 undergraduate programmes on February 1. Among these, 20 undergraduate and 18 postgraduate courses will be filled based on CUET scores. Additionally, one seat per programme is reserved for single girl child candidates in university schools and up to 2 percent of seats in each programme will be allocated under sports quota.

Admission to B.Ed courses 2025 to top BE colleges one needs to prepare for entrance exams, and score well in them. Entrance exams are conducted at various levels including, national level, state level, and university level. Some of the commonly accepted entrance exams in 2025 include [Bihar B.Ed CET](#), [UP B.Ed JEE](#), [MAH B.Ed CET](#), [TSEdCET](#), [APEdCET](#), etc. B.Ed course admission eligibility requires one to complete 10+2 in any stream from a recognized board with an aggregate of 50% or more. Further, the admissions to BE

courses rose after the Government of India passed the New Education Policy. The policy emphasizes quality education for students creating the demand for more skilled teachers in the education sector. Moreover, B.Ed admission can be offered either after completing graduation or post-graduation in the relevant discipline and is also offered in integrated programs such as BA-B. Ed or B.Sc-B.Ed which can be pursued after Class 12th. The average fee ranges from INR 15,000 to INR 3 lakh depending on the institution.

Law Entrance Exams in India 2025

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Several key law entrance exams are conducted in India for admission to prestigious law schools. The Common Law Admission Test (CLAT), conducted by the Consortium of National Law Universities, is one of the most sought-after exams for admission to 26 NLUs and other top law schools. It is usually held in the first week of December, with applications open from July to mid-November. Similarly, the All India Law Entrance Test (AILET) is conducted exclusively for admission to NLU Delhi. The exam is scheduled for the second week of December, and applications are accepted from August to mid-November.

Another important exam is the Law School Admission Test (LSAT) India, conducted by LSAC Global for admission to top private law schools such as Jindal Global Law School, BITS Law School, and Manipal University. It is held twice a year, in January and May, with applications opening in November. For students aspiring to study law in Maharashtra, the MH CET Law exam is an essential gateway for admission to 3-year and 5-year LL.B. programs in various state law colleges. Here's a closer look at the unique characteristics that distinguish the American and Indian educational systems.

The Organization of Education in Schools

There are notable differences between the fundamental educational frameworks in the US and India. With the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, India recently redesigned its educational system. This new framework used a 5+3+3+4 model in place of the conventional 10+2 scheme. Preschool and the early primary grades are included in the foundation stage, which runs from ages three to eight and encourages play-based and activity-centered learning.



Methods of Learning

With pupils having to learn vast amounts of material, India's traditional reliance on memory has frequently come under fire. However, the NEP 2020 aims to move away from memorization and toward a more comprehensive, student-centered approach that places an emphasis on creativity and critical thinking. However, this shift is still in its infancy, and rote learning is still a major problem in many regions of the nation.

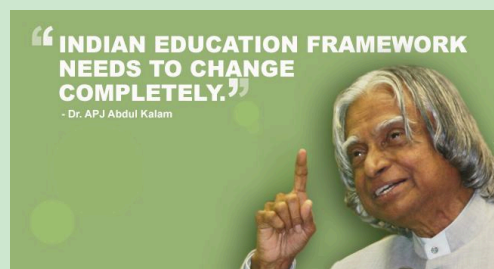
Low Outcomes, Limited Potential: India's Education System Needs Reform

India, with 20% of the world's youth, has a demographic advantage poised to peak in 2041. However, this potential can only be realized if its youth possess the necessary skills to boost global productivity. A strong education system, especially at the higher education level, is crucial to achieving this. While India has improved access to basic education, significant gaps in higher education must be addressed.

An effective education system is defined by two key elements: widespread access and high enrollment rates across all levels, and quality education reflected in strong learning outcomes.

India has made strides in primary and upper primary education, achieving near-universal enrollment (100.13% GER) at the elementary level (grades 1-8), up from 97.4% in 2011-12. Secondary school transition rates are also improving (88.81%), leading to a 79.56% GER at the secondary level (grades 9-10). However, enrollment significantly drops at higher levels.



Only 78.41% of students transition to higher secondary education, resulting in a drastically lower GER of 57.76%. GER for higher education.

This is supported by data showing less than 10% of the population holding a graduate degree or higher, while the majority of the workforce has only primary (52.4%) or secondary (37.8%) education. This low attainment in higher education results in a workforce largely confined to low-skill, low-paying jobs, limiting India's potential for high-skilled economic activities.

Drowning in Debt: The Crushing Cost of College in India

In Chennai, a 53-year-old business consultant and mother of two began saving for her sons' education years ago when they were in primary school. Despite this foresight, the rising costs of higher education have significantly strained her family's finances. One son is currently studying law at O.P. Jindal Global University, while the other is pursuing a mathematics degree at Krea University. Although the family managed to cover the expenses for their older son's law degree using their savings, they were compelled to sell some of their property to meet the unexpectedly high costs of their younger son's education.

Krea, in addition to the nearly Rs 30 lakh spent on their older son's three-year law degree.

This family's experience is not unique. Across India, parents are struggling to afford the escalating costs of private university education. Faced with yearly increases in tuition and other charges, parents are saving diligently, taking out loans, and even selling assets to finance their children's education at these expensive institutions. They do so with the hope that this significant investment will ultimately pay off in their children's future careers.

How can Indian universities strategically position themselves for significant advancements in the near future?

India's massive higher education system, with over 56,000 institutions, 40 million students, and 1.5 million teachers, struggles to meet global benchmarks for access, quality, research, industry ties, and faculty development. The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 aims to boost enrollment to 50% by 2035 and place Indian universities among the world's top 100.

To realize this vision, India needs to add 26 million student places by 2035, demanding significant investment in personnel, technology, and infrastructure. A 2023 EY-Parthenon-FICCI report recommends prioritizing the initial five-year plan out of the five outlined in a previous 2022 report. Success depends on focusing on quality education, industry relevance, research and innovation, and inclusivity—the cornerstones of India's higher education goals for the next two years.

Over the next 1-3 years, Indian higher education needs to focus on several key areas to improve:

Quality Education: Institutions at all levels, even the top-ranked ones, face challenges across the entire educational process.

Faculty: There's a severe faculty shortage, with even prestigious institutions like IITs and IIMs having significant vacancies. Recruitment and development are crucial.

Digitalization: A lack of clear government policies for technology use in higher education, coupled with limited digital learning integration in weaker institutions, needs to be addressed.

Internationalization: While Indian universities are increasingly looking to establish international campuses, progress has been slow.

Academic Flexibility: Few institutions have adopted the government's academic bank of credits system or offer flexible curriculum and multiple entry/exit points.

Therefore, India's immediate priorities should be: expanding industry-linked PhD programs, creating a dedicated technology policy for higher education, and aligning online courses with national qualification standards.

Connecting with industry is crucial for quality education and ensuring graduates meet industry needs. While top institutions should become industry research and consulting partners, industry investment in Indian higher education, especially in less prestigious institutions, is currently low. With overall graduate employability at just over 50% in 2023, universities must prioritize industry-ready training, career development, and relevant programs.

Therefore, short-term solutions include industry partnerships for work-based learning, establishing centers of excellence, co-developing courses, and hiring industry professionals as professors. Institutions also need career development programs, corporate relations offices, technology transfer cells, and curriculum focused on employability.

Therefore, India's higher education system, while vast, faces significant hurdles in achieving global standards. Inadequate funding, staff shortages, and weak industry ties are just some of the challenges that must be overcome. The National Education Policy 2020 offers a promising roadmap, emphasizing accessibility, equity, and quality. However, realizing the ambitious goals set for 2047 requires more than just long-term vision. It demands a shift towards tangible, short-term targets focused on four key pillars: quality education, industry alignment, research and innovation, and inclusivity. Only through the concerted and collaborative efforts of all stakeholders can India's higher education system truly leap forward, embracing innovation and modernization to prepare its students for the future.

The government is encouraging young people to register on the platform to access a wide range of career opportunities. Labour Secretary Sumita Dawra noted that countries like Germany, Finland, and various Middle Eastern nations are actively looking for skilled workers across different industries. Through this partnership, NCS will help facilitate these international job opportunities for Indian job seekers. V. Suresh, CEO of FoundIt, praised the initiative, stating that it aligns with the government's vision of 'Sabka Saath, Sabka Vikas' by ensuring more inclusive job opportunities. He highlighted



that employment is a key driver of economic growth and that the government's focus on career development is reflected in the growing success of the NCS portal.

AI to impact repetitive jobs, generate large scale employment from FY27: IT industry leader

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is poised to significantly influence the job market in the coming years. While AI is expected to automate many repetitive tasks, leading to the displacement of certain roles, it is also anticipated to create a substantial number of new employment opportunities. According to a study by ServiceNow, India will need to upskill or reskill 16.2 million workers in AI and automation to meet the country's skill deficit. Additionally, the study predicts that 4.7 million new jobs in the technology sector will be created by 2027.

The manufacturing sector is expected to experience the most significant disruption, with 23% of its workforce primed for automation and skill augmentation.

Other sectors likely to be affected include agriculture, forestry, fishing (22%), wholesale and retail trade (11.6%), transportation and storage (8%), and construction (7.8%).

In Hyderabad, industry experts estimate that out of approximately 905,000 IT employees, 15-20% of jobs could be eliminated by some form of generative AI. However, they also anticipate that more jobs will be generated due to automation. For every 2-3 jobs that may be lost, 4-5 new jobs are expected to emerge in AI and machine learning segments. This underscores the importance of skilling, upskilling, and reskilling in emerging technologies to seize these new opportunities.

He recognized the concerns surrounding potential job losses attributed to emerging technologies but asserted that these challenges can be addressed through effective skilling and upskilling programs.

Government officials also emphasize the need for workforce adaptation. Telangana's IT and Industries Minister, D. Sridhar Babu, highlighted the importance of integrating AI in governance to enhance productivity and lead technology to the next level. He acknowledged the fear of job losses due to new technology but stressed that this can be mitigated through skilling and upskilling initiatives.

In summary, while AI is expected to automate certain tasks and potentially displace some jobs, it also presents significant opportunities for job creation. The key to leveraging these opportunities lies in proactive upskilling and reskilling of the workforce to align with the evolving demands of the job market.
