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Cutoff Marks Dip Below 90% in Top Mumbai Colleges: Second Merit List Brings Relief to Students

In a significant shift that has sparked both relief and surprise across Mumbai's academic circles, the second merit list for undergraduate admissions at several of the city's most prestigious colleges has revealed a steep drop in cutoff percentages for BA and BCom courses — many dipping below the 90% mark.

This drop, in some cases as steep as 15%, indicates a changing tide in student preferences and broader admission dynamics this year. The latest list, announced on Saturday, has especially impacted sought-after institutions like St. Xavier's College, Jai Hind College, Podar College, and Ruia College, which have historically maintained exceptionally high admission benchmarks. Experts attribute this trend to a growing tilt

among students towards newer, more specialized or professional courses with a focus on employability and future readiness over traditional streams. As a result, demand for science and commerce programs continues to remain robust, while general arts and commerce streams are seeing reduced competition, leading to the lowering of cutoff marks.

Cutoffs for top Mumbai colleges have dropped notably in the second merit list. St. Xavier's College's BA (English & Psychology) program fell from 98% to 92.17%. Podar College's BCom cutoff dropped from 93% to 89.5%, while Jai Hind College's BCom fell from 94.2% to 89.6%. These changes bring hope to students with moderate scores, highlighting the competitive nature of the first list. Interest in science courses is declining. At Ruia College, BSc cutoffs for Biochemistry and Physics fell by over 10%, raising faculty concerns. Principals say the second list reflects actual student preferences and demand. St. Xavier's head noted a shift to career-focused courses. Students await the third list with hope.

NEET PG 2025: City Intimation Slip Released to Help Candidates Plan Ahead

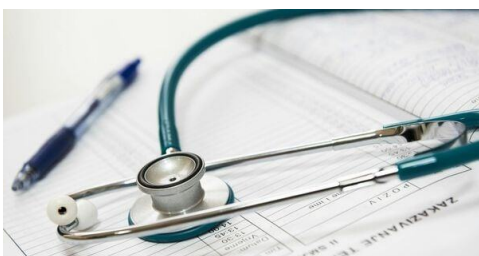

Bridging Language Gaps: IIT-Bombay Unveils AI Datasets to Make Indian Languages More Accessible

In a significant stride toward making artificial intelligence (AI) more inclusive and representative of India's rich linguistic diversity, researchers at the Indian Institute of Technology Bombay (IIT-B) have unveiled a comprehensive suite of AI datasets aimed at simplifying Indian language texts.

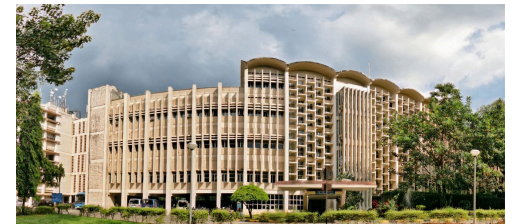
For over five years, a dedicated team of researchers has been quietly working behind the scenes to solve a major problem in Indian AI development: the lack of high-quality, open-access datasets in regional languages. While English-centric AI systems have seen rapid growth, Indian languages like Hindi, Marathi, Tamil, and others have lagged due to limited resources.

Now, in collaboration with several IITs across the country—including IIT Madras, IIT Kanpur, IIT Hyderabad, and IIT Delhi—this massive effort has culminated in the release of 28 finely tuned AI models trained on texts in 40 different languages. These models cover a wide range of domains and can perform tasks such as simplification, translation, and language generation. "This isn't just a technical achievement—it's

said a senior researcher from IIT-B. "Most language tools today are designed for English speakers. We're changing that narrative."

The new IIT datasets aim to help AI systems better process Indian languages, using texts from public documents, parliamentary debates, and the Samagraha Bharat project. These resources train large language models (LLMs) for tasks like translation, summarization, Q&A, and speech recognition.

Tech giants like Google and Microsoft, along with startups and academic institutions, see them as key to future innovation. This initiative is part of a larger push to make AI inclusive for regional language users across India. Researchers call it the start of an AI future that understands all of India, not just its English speakers.



AP SSC Results Stir Controversy Amid Political Crossfire and Public Outcry

The Directorate of Government Examinations, Andhra Pradesh, is currently under intense scrutiny over the evaluation of SSC (Secondary School Certificate) answer scripts for the March 2025 Public Examinations. While officials maintain that the process was one of the most transparent and accurate in recent history, a wave of political backlash and public concern has sparked a heated debate over the credibility of the examination system.

According to official data, a staggering 45.96 lakh answer scripts were assessed by a dedicated team consisting of 16,482 Assistant Examiners, 5,494 Special Assistants, and 2,747 Chief Examiners. Each examiner evaluated approximately 40 papers

per day, allowing the mammoth task to be completed efficiently. The Directorate proudly cited a 99.76% accuracy rate, claiming it to be in line with or better than previous years.

Despite reassurances, concerns grew after results, with 34,709 recheck, 64,000 reverification, and 2,112 recounting requests. Marks changed in 11,175 cases; 55,188 remained accurate, with only 0.068% showing changes over five marks. Five examiners were suspended for procedural breaches, signaling accountability, though critics point to deeper issues. As political tensions rise, restoring student trust is crucial to keep education above politics.

Bhim Sena Unveils Bold Education Reforms Ahead of Nagpur Civic Polls

The proposed tax rebate scheme is expected to offer financial incentives to families enrolling their children in revamped civic schools. This move, according to Bhim Sena, will help reduce the dependence on expensive private schooling while

simultaneously increasing trust and enrollment in public education.

Experts believe that if implemented effectively, these reforms could be a game-changer for the city's struggling public school network. Nagpur's municipal schools have long faced criticism over outdated infrastructure, teacher shortages, and declining student numbers. Transitioning to English medium could, they say, attract new interest and help improve learning outcomes — particularly in today's globalized world where English proficiency often plays a critical role in career advancement.

Reactions to Bhim Sena's English medium proposal are mixed. Many parents, like Kavita Gaikwad, welcome it, hoping for quality English education in government schools. However, educators warn that switching requires more than new textbooks—it demands teacher training and curriculum upgrades. The proposal has sparked political debate, with rivals accusing it of electoral tactics. As elections near in Nagpur, education has become a key issue, with Bhim Sena planning to release a detailed implementation plan soon.



Rajasthan Government Launches 'Bal Vatikas' in PM Shri Schools to Boost Early Childhood Education

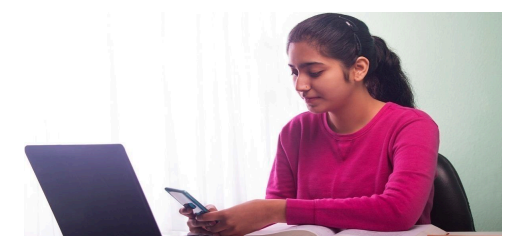

Over 61,000 Students Confirm Admissions in First Round of GCAS 2025; Second Round Commences June 3 -VidyarthiMitra News Desk

The Gujarat Common Admission Services (GCAS) portal has successfully completed the first round of undergraduate admissions for the 2025–26 academic year, marking a significant step in the state's centralized yet flexible admission process. A total of 61,540 students have confirmed their seats across 13 public universities in Gujarat. These universities collectively offer 471,710 seats across a diverse range of undergraduate programs, indicating that the admission process is still in its early but productive phase.

In this first round, the GCAS portal extended 381,046 admission offers to students whose documents had been verified. Since students can apply to multiple colleges and receive several offers, the figure reflects offer letters—not individual applicants. This is a feature of the decentralized merit system, under which each college prepares its own merit list and independently offers admissions through the common platform.

This system benefits students with higher scores, who tend to receive multiple offers during the early rounds. Meanwhile, students with relatively lower scores are still given ample opportunity to secure a seat in the later rounds. Officials estimate that around 60% to 70% of total seats will be filled by the end of the first phase.

The second round of the Gujarat Common Admission Services (GCAS) admission process is set to commence on Tuesday, June 3, 2025, and will be followed by three more rounds, with each round running over a span of two days. This structured, phased approach is designed to provide multiple opportunities

students to secure admission into their preferred undergraduate programs across 13 public universities in Gujarat.

These upcoming rounds are especially important for students who either did not receive offers in the first round, chose not to accept the offers, or are waiting for a more preferred college or course based on their merit and availability of seats. As admissions proceed, the system dynamically updates seat allocations, thereby increasing the chances for all eligible students to receive favorable outcomes.

Moreover, a significant number—approximately 70,000 students—are expected to appear for the Class 12 supplementary examinations. These students were previously ineligible due to pending results but will gain access to the admission process in the later stages once their scores are declared. The inclusion of supplementary candidates reflects the GCAS system's focus on equity, inclusivity, and second-chance access to higher education.

Students should check the GCAS portal daily for updates and merit lists to avoid missing deadlines. With many seats still open, GCAS ensures fair and transparent access to higher education in Gujarat.

UK Immigration Reform 2025: What It Means for International Students.

The United Kingdom is set to implement sweeping immigration reforms that will significantly impact international students. In a white paper released by Prime Minister Keir Starmer’s government, the focus is on reducing net migration and tightening education-related visa routes, while still attracting top global talent.

Stricter Student Visa Requirements

Securing a UK student visa will become more challenging. Education providers must now comply with tougher standards, including:

- A higher Basic Compliance Assessment pass rate
- Mandatory participation in the Agent Quality Framework
- A new red/amber/green public rating system

These measures aim to curb the rapid growth in student numbers from lower-ranked universities, where visa issuances rose by 49% between 2021 and 2023.

Graduate Route Cut to 18 Months

The popular post-study work visa, known as the Graduate Route, will be shortened from 2 years to 18 months. Additionally, a new levy on universities’ international student income will be introduced to fund domestic skills training—signaling a shift away from reliance on foreign talent.

Restrictions on Dependents

Taught postgraduate students will face new limits on bringing dependents to the UK. Dependent visa numbers rose sharply from 16,000 in 2019 to over 143,000 in 2023. Under the new rules, most dependents must meet English language criteria and show

increased proficiency over time to remain or settle in the UK.

Tougher English Language Standards

Language requirements will increase across the board:

- Main applicants must meet B2 level (upper-intermediate) English
- Adult dependents must meet A1 on arrival and reach B2 for permanent settlement

This change will notably affect those seeking to transition to skilled worker routes or permanent residency.

Exceptions for High-Skilled Talent

While general migration routes are narrowing, the government is expanding opportunities for PhD holders, researchers, and workers in high-demand fields like artificial intelligence and life sciences. The Global Talent visa will be broadened, and caps on business transfers will be doubled.

Pressure on Universities

UK universities are being pushed to reduce their dependence on international tuition fees. The government is urging them to focus on quality and sustainable recruitment practices, especially in lower-ranked institutions.

When Will the Changes Take Effect?

Though not yet law, these proposals are expected to move swiftly through Parliament and could be implemented as early as the 2025–26 academic year.

Bottom Line

For international students, the UK remains an option—but a more selective one. Strong academic records, advanced English skills, and strategic planning will be more important than ever.

U.S. Tightens Scrutiny on Harvard-Linked Visa Applicants: Social Media, Online Presence Under Review.

In a controversial policy shift, the U.S. government is intensifying scrutiny of visa applicants linked to Harvard University, citing concerns over antisemitism. The directive, signed by Secretary of State Marco Rubio, instructs embassies to begin immediate checks on applicants' social media activity, sparking alarm across academia and civil rights groups.

Social Media Under the Microscope

The policy mandates detailed reviews of online behavior for all Harvard-affiliated international applicants. Limited or private digital footprints may be viewed as suspicious, with officers instructed to deny visas if credibility is in doubt.

SEVIS Access Revoked

In a major blow, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) has revoked Harvard’s access to SEVIS, the federal system that tracks international students. This halts new visa processing and endangers the legal status of nearly 7,000 international students.

Accusations Against Harvard

DHS, led by Secretary Kristi Noem, accuses Harvard of failing to address campus antisemitism. While specific incidents remain undisclosed, the university is being penalized for allegedly not curbing hate speech or ensuring campus safety.

Academic and Legal Fallout

Legal experts and university officials warn the move could be politically motivated and infringe on free speech rights. Critics argue it threatens international academic collaboration and sets a troubling precedent for visa policies based on online activity or campus culture.

What’s Next?

Harvard is reportedly preparing a legal challenge. Meanwhile, other U.S. institutions are watching closely as the policy could soon affect international academic mobility nationwide. The message to global scholars is clear: studying in the U.S. now comes with increased scrutiny and risk.

The situation remains fluid, with diplomatic, legal, and educational consequences still unfolding. For now, uncertainty hangs over thousands of international students hoping to pursue their academic futures in the U.S.

As the demand for global education grows, Europe is proving to be a practical and attractive alternative, redefining the dreams of students from India’s heartland.

TOEFL to Undergo Major Revamp: AI Integration, Adaptive Testing, and Simpler Process Ahead.

The Educational Testing Service (ETS) has announced a major overhaul of the TOEFL iBT, aiming to make the English proficiency test more adaptive, secure, and globally aligned. The changes, which began rolling out on May 30, 2025, will continue into 2026, significantly transforming the testing experience for international students.

A key update is the introduction of adaptive testing in the reading and listening sections starting in 2026. This new format adjusts the difficulty of questions in real time based on a test-taker’s performance, offering a more personalized and accurate assessment of language skills. ETS is also introducing AI-driven identity verification through its ENTRUST system to enhance test security and reduce check-in delays.

To make TOEFL scores easier to interpret worldwide, ETS is launching a dual scoring system. In addition to the traditional 0–120 scale, score reports will include a 1–6 band score aligned with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), making it easier for institutions and immigration offices to assess applicants' language levels.

For those taking the TOEFL Home Edition, ETS has revamped the platform to include better navigation, trained in-house proctors, and enhanced AI-based identity checks. These changes follow earlier improvements, such as shorter test durations and faster score updates, as TOEFL evolves to meet the changing needs of global students.



Kerala Schools Reopen After Summer Vacation with New Projects and Safety Measures

Delhi Government Launches 300 Virtual Labs to Enhance Experiential Learning in Schools

In a bid to enhance hands-on learning, the Delhi government has introduced over 300 interactive virtual labs for students and teachers in government schools. Developed under the PM eVIDYA initiative by the Ministry of Education, these labs are aligned with the NCERT curriculum and are accessible via the Diksha portal. Targeting students from classes VI to XII, the labs aim to support learners, especially in schools lacking physical lab infrastructure.

These virtual labs offer a variety of resources including simulations, quizzes, videos, and interactive tools covering science, mathematics, and language subjects. Students can now digitally conduct experiments such as measuring pressure in liquids or observing seed germination using their computers or smartphones, making learning engaging and

accessible beyond traditional classroom settings.

To ensure the successful integration of these tools, the State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT) has directed school heads to incorporate virtual labs into everyday teaching. Additionally, District Institutes of Education and Training (DIET) will monitor usage and gather feedback on the labs' impact on student learning and engagement.

While the initiative is widely welcomed, teachers have raised concerns about infrastructure gaps such as limited access to functional computers and reliable internet connectivity. However, the move aligns with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 by promoting technology-integrated education and holds promise for transforming science and math education in government schools across Delhi.

Allocate More Funds for Education of Children from Koraga Community

At an event organized by the Shri Koragajja Seva Trust in Vamanjoor, social activist and Communist Party of India (Marxist) district secretary, Muneer Katipalla, emphasized the urgent need for increased educational funding for the Koraga community. He advocated for targeted developmental programs and scholarship schemes to ensure that Koraga children have equitable access to quality education.

The event also featured the distribution of scholarship funds to 100 students from economically disadvantaged backgrounds, reinforcing the commitment to uplift marginalized communities through education.



JD(U) Applauds Nitish Kumar's Initiatives for Uplifting EBCs and OBCs

Further reinforcing this commitment, the Bihar government's 2025-26 budget allocated ₹60,954 crore to the education sector, with a notable increase in monthly scholarships for backward and extremely backward class students from ₹1,000 to ₹2,000. Additionally, ₹3,303 crore has been earmarked for student scholarships, with 90% of the beneficiaries belonging to OBC, EBC, and SC communities.

These initiatives reflect the JD(U)'s and Nitish Kumar's ongoing efforts to foster social equity and provide tangible support to historically marginalized communities in Bihar.

Tata Memorial Hospital Raises ₹2.8 Crore to Support Education of Pediatric Cancer Survivors

Rajasthan High Court Restricts Scholarships for Affluent Students, Citing Misuse of Public Funds

In a significant move to uphold the integrity of welfare schemes meant for the underprivileged, the Rajasthan High Court has ordered the state government to disqualify applicants with annual family incomes above ₹25 lakh from the Swami Vivekananda Scholarship for Higher Studies. The directive comes in response to a petition highlighting that the scheme was being misused by financially well-off students, defeating its original purpose of empowering economically disadvantaged youth.

The scholarship, earlier known as the Rajiv Gandhi Scholarship for Academic Excellence, was launched to help meritorious students from Rajasthan pursue higher education in prestigious institutions both in India and abroad. To ensure fairness, the scheme classifies applicants into three income-based categories:

- E1: Annual income up to ₹8 lakh
- E2: Between ₹8 lakh and ₹25 lakh
- E3: Above ₹25 lakh

Students under the E3 category were eligible for up to 70% of their tuition fees, with a cap of ₹35 lakh, though living expenses were not covered. However, the court found this provision problematic, especially when extended to students from affluent families who neither demonstrated exceptional academic merit nor financial need. Justice Anoop Kumar Dhand, who presided over the case, expressed strong reservations about the disbursement of large sums of public money to such candidates, calling it a misuse of limited state resources.

The court's decision was rooted in concerns that deserving candidates—particularly those in the E1 and E2 categories—were being pushed aside as a result of these flawed disbursements. In many cases, applicants from the E3 bracket lacked notable academic

credentials, yet were able to secure scholarships meant for those with fewer means and higher merit. The judgment emphasized that public welfare funds must be used responsibly and reach their intended recipients to ensure equity and justice in educational access.

In addition to barring further disbursements under the E3 category, the High Court has directed the Rajasthan government to submit a comprehensive list of all scholarship recipients since the scheme's inception, including detailed records of their annual family incomes. This data will help in evaluating the scale of misuse and reshaping policy for better targeting in future iterations of the program.

The ruling sends a clear message: government-funded welfare programs must not become vehicles of privilege for the wealthy. By tightening eligibility and reinforcing scrutiny, the court has taken a crucial step in restoring the credibility of a scheme that was designed to be a lifeline for Rajasthan's brightest, yet financially disadvantaged, students.

This landmark decision is expected to set a precedent for stricter oversight of similar welfare schemes across the country. It also reinforces the principle that public resources must be reserved for those who truly need them to achieve educational and social mobility.
