Maharashtra Makes Co-education Mandatory for New Schools

The Maharashtra government has decided that all new schools must be co-educational, ending the practice of establishing separate boys' or girls' schools. Schools sharing the same premises will also be encouraged to gradually transition to a co-ed model. The policy aims to promote gender equality, healthy interaction, and social readiness among students.

According to the School Education Department, co-education helps reduce stereotypes and builds confidence, teamwork, and emotional intelligence qualities essential for future careers. The move has largely received positive feedback from parents and educators and is expected to particularly benefit rural students, especially girls, by improving access to quality education.

1,764 MBBS & BDS Seats Still Vacant in Maharashtra as Round-3 Admissions Begin

Maharashtra has entered the third round of medical admissions with 1,764 seats still vacant, including 789 MBBS seats and 975 BDS seats, according to the State CET Cell.

Despite strong demand, withdrawals, interstate movement, and cancellation of fraudulent applications have left a significant number of seats open across government and private institutions.

Officials note that many students shifted to preferred colleges through the All-India quota, while the recent crackdown on fake documents which led to over 200 candidates being barred also increased vacancies.

Round-3 now offers a major opportunity for students with midrange NEET scores, especially those who narrowly missed earlier cut-offs.

Candidates are advised to monitor the CET Cell website for updated merit lists, schedules, and document requirements. The state aims to maximise seat filling before the mop-up round, ensuring aspiring medical students secure placements without losing a year.

Maharashtra Plans to Conduct CET Twice a Year to Ease Students' Burden

In a major student-centric reform, the Maharashtra government is considering holding the Maharashtra Common Entrance Test (MHT-CET) twice a year, bringing the state's admission process closer to national-level exams like JEE Main and NEET (which is also exploring multiple attempts in future).

The proposal aims to reduce pressure on lakhs of aspirants seeking admission to professional programmes including engineering, pharmacy, law, MBA, architecture, and other allied courses.

A committee has been appointed to examine feasibility, logistics, exam-centre availability, and academic calendar alignment. According to officials, conducting two sessions annually would offer students a second chance within the same academic year, avoiding the loss of a year for those who underperform in a single high-stakes attempt.

The CET Cell is exploring January and April windows for the two phases. If approved, this move will be a significant boost for students across Maharashtra, ensuring flexibility, better score-improvement opportunity, and reduced exam stress.

\The state is expected to finalise the structure after reviewing the committee's report and centre availability. An official notification will be issued on the CET Cell portal once confirmed.

Maharashtra to Link Scholarships Directly With Admission **Process From 2026**

In a key reform aimed at easing the financial burden on students and simplifying administrative processes, the Maharashtra government has the announced that MahaDBT scholarship and freeship system will be fully integrated with the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) conducted by the CET Cell beginning academic year 2026-27.

This means students seeking admission to professional programmes including medical, engineering, pharmacy, management, law, and teacher-training courses will have their scholarship eligibility and approval processed at the time of admission, removing the need for a separate, often timeconsuming application process.

Currently, students must reapply for scholarships every academic year through MahaDBT and often face long delays, technical issues, verification hurdles. Under the new system, the document verification completed during admissions will serve both purposes, ensuring that eligible students receive fee support automatically.

Higher and Technical Education Minister Chandrakant Patil stated that educational institutions will be reimbursed by August each year, allowing colleges to manage finances more efficiently and preventing students from having to pay fees upfront.

Maharashtra spends nearly ₹8,000 annually on various scholarship and freeship schemes that benefit SC, ST, OBC, EWS, minority, and economically disadvantaged students. Officials believe that this integration will significantly reduce paperwork, prevent duplication of verification, speed up disbursement, and increase transparency in the scholarship

Maharashtra Government May Reconsider Faculty **Recruitment Rules**

The Maharashtra state government is closely monitoring the response to its latest faculty recruitment drive and has hinted that it may seek a review of the recently tightened hiring rules for universities if the turnout of applicants remains unsatisfactory. The recruitment process currently includes 659 pending faculty posts across various state universities and affiliated colleges, covering disciplines in arts, science, commerce, and professional education.

Higher and Technical Education Minister Chandrakant Patil stated that the government will take a data-driven decision. Bymid-November, universities are expected to submit reports detailing how many candidates have applied for the advertised positions. "Once we have a clear picture of the response, we will consider approaching the Governor to re-evaluate the revised recruitment parameters," the minister said.

The move comes in response to concerns raised by several university administrators, teachers' associations, and academic bodies, who believe the new selection criteria are overly rigid and could potentially deter qualified applicants. Under the updated rules, the weightage for the personal interview has been reduced from 40% to 25%, with the remaining 75% assigned to Academic, Teaching, and Research (ATR) credentials. These include factors such as publications, research projects, patents, teaching experience, and academic qualifications.

Critics argue that the reduced interview weightage undermines the importance of communication skills, classroom engagement, and the candidate's ability to connect with students — aspects that are difficult to evaluate purely through academic records. Some also point out that rural universities or newly established institutions might struggle to attract enough qualified candidates under the current system, potentially leaving posts vacant for longer periods.

On the other hand, supporters of the revised framework claim it brings transparency, merit-based greater selection, and academic rigor, aligning Maharashtra's hiring standards with national-level practices followed by institutions like central universities and IITs.

The government's decision to possibly reconsider the policy reflects a balancing act between maintaining high academic standards and ensuring adequate staffing across universities. If the application numbers remain low, a review committee could be formed to analyze the rules and recommend adjustments to make the recruitment process both fair and feasible.

This development is part of the state's broader effort to strengthen higher education quality, fill long-pending vacancies, and ensure Maharashtra's universities remain competitive and well-staffed in the evolving academic landscape.

Maharashtra Expands Pharmacy Education: Over -VidyarthiMitra News Desk 6,000 New B.Pharm Seats Added

The State Common Entrance Test Cell, Maharashtra has significantly expanded opportunities pharmacy aspirants by approving 38 new pharmacy colleges across the state. This move has led to the creation of over 6,000 additional B.Pharm seats, marking a major strengthening step in pharmaceutical education and meeting the growing demand for skilled professionals in the healthcare and life sciences sectors.

Following this expansion, more than 6,100 students have already secured admissions during the third round of the Centralised Admission Process (CAP) for the current academic session. With these new additions, the total number of B.Pharm seats has increased to approximately 56,000, distributed across 447 pharmacy institutes statewide.

Officials have stated that this increase aims to enhance access to professional pharmacy education, particularly in semi-urban and rural regions, where the availability of such programs was previously limited. The new colleges are expected to boost regional employment, encourage local research and innovation, and support the state's pharmaceutical growing healthcare industries.

Education experts, however, have advised careful monitoring of infrastructure, faculty quality, and regulatory compliance to maintain high academic standards as the number of institutions grows. Overall, this expansion represents a major policy move by the Maharashtra government broadening toward technical and healthcare education while addressing the rising demand for qualified pharmacists across the state.

UGC Encourages Students to Participate in YUVAi – Global Youth AI Challenge 2025–26

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has called upon higher education institutions across the country to actively promote student participation in the YUVAi – Global Youth AI Challenge 2025-26, an initiative launched by the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) and IndiaAI. The program aims to identify, train, and empower young innovators (aged 13 to 21 years) to design AI-based solutions that can make a positive social and industrial impact.

The challenge is open to school and college students, allowing participation individually or in teams of two. Once registered, selected participants will undergo a 10-day virtual bootcamp in November 2025, where they will receive hands-on mentorship from AI experts, industry professionals, and startup mentors. The bootcamp will focus on helping students develop their project ideas, create prototypes, and understand the ethical and practical applications of artificial intelligence in real-world scenarios.

As per the official schedule, registrations opened on October 10, 2025, and will remain open until October 31, 2025. Shortlisted teams will take part in virtual sessions through November, and the final selection of winning projects will be announced by December 31, 2025. The top teams will be invited to present their innovations at the India-AI Impact Summit, scheduled for February 19-20, 2026, at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi — a global platform where innovators, policymakers, and technology leaders converge.

The competition carries prizes worth ₹85 lakh, including ₹15 lakh each for the top three teams, ₹10 lakh each for the next three, and two special recognition awards for creativity and social impact. Moreover, the top 20 teams will gain travel assistance, investor-readiness guidance, and national-level exposure to help transform their ideas into scalable innovations.

Through this initiative, the UGC and MeitY aim to foster a new generation of AI talent equipped with innovation, problem-solving, and entrepreneurial skills. The YUVAi Challenge not only provides a platform for students to showcase their creativity and technical expertise, but also aligns with India's broader goal of becoming a global leader in responsible and inclusive artificial intelligence development.

This program stands as a unique opportunity for India's youth to engage with emerging technologies, gain mentorship from experts, and contribute meaningful AI solutions that address real societal and environmental challenges.





NMC Postpones NExT Exam by 3-4 Years

The National Medical Commission (NMC) has decided to delay the implementation of the National Exit Test (NExT) for another three to four years. In the meantime, the commission will organize mock or trial exams to evaluate the test's practicality and collect feedback from medical students and institutions.

These pilot runs will be fully funded by the NMC, and the final launch of NExT will depend on the findings and responses gathered from these trials.

The decision came after a meeting between NMC Chairman Dr. Abhijay Sheth and representatives of the Federation of All India Medical Association (FAIMA), who presented a nationwide survey aimed at enhancing medical education and improving doctors' welfare. Dr. Sheth appreciated FAIMA's data-driven recommendations and assured that they would be considered in upcoming policy discussions.

Initially scheduled for August 2025, NExT—designed to serve as both a medical licensing and postgraduate entrance examination for MBBS graduates—has been postponed due to ongoing legal, administrative, and logistical hurdles.

Debate Over NEP-2020 Raises Concerns for Students and States

A growing debate between the Centre and states like Kerala, Tamil Nadu, and West Bengal over the National Education Policy (NEP-2020) is beginning to impact school students and education systems on the ground. While these states argue that some NEP proposals interfere with their existing education models, the larger concern is how delays in coordination are affecting learning programmes and school funding.

Funds under key schemes like Samagra Shiksha were reportedly paused for states not aligning fully with NEP guidelines. This has led to worries about classroom resources, teacher salaries, and support for government schools—directly affecting students, especially from low-income backgrounds. In Kerala, a temporary MoU under the PM-SHRI scheme was signed to access pending funds but later paused after political disagreement, creating uncertainty about upgrades promised to schools under the project

States like Kerala, which already have strong education outcomes, say they want to adopt reforms at their own pace without compromising scientific learning or introducing unverified traditional content. Education experts stress that students' access to quality learning, technology, and equitable schooling should remain the priority, urging both Centre and states to work together so young learners are not caught in policy disputes.

Medical Admission Fraud Major Crackdown on Maharashtra

(CET) Cell has taken stringent action against a large-scale attempt at academic fraud, leading to the barring of 151 students from the ongoing Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) admissions process. This significant and concerning revelation came to light during a meticulous verification drive conducted as part of the third round of counselling for the state's coveted medical college seats.

The extensive audit exposed what officials have termed widespread document manipulation and the submission of forged records. The investigation specifically targeted the validity of documents submitted by aspiring medical students. The primary offenders were identified as out-of-state candidates who attempted to misuse the system to illegally secure seats intended for Maharashtra domiciled students. Among the most common and critical forms of fraud uncovered were the of false domicile submission certificates, which are essential for claiming state quota reservations, and the presentation of mismatched marksheets, suggesting an attempt to misrepresent academic eligibility or ranking.

Maharashtra's Common Entrance Test The CET Cell has not only cancelled the admissions of the involved students but has also taken the crucial step of alerting national bodies. They have formally notified the Medical Counselling Committee (MCC) and the National Medical Commission (NMC). This inter-state communication is vital to ensure that these national authorities can launch their own verification processes regarding the academic and identity details of the debarred students. This collective effort is aimed at preventing these individuals from attempting similar frauds in other states across the country.

> Learning from this incident, the CET Cell is committed to reforming its admission framework. The immediate plan is to more securely fill the vacant seats left by the disqualified students through centralized counselling. Furthermore, there is a clear intent to implement enhanced, stricter verification protocols, which will involve deeper scrutiny, potentially including by the respective physical checks government college verification teams, to ensure that only honest and rightful candidates gain admission. Officials note that several other states have already adopted stringent measures to combat similar malpractices, and Maharashtra's CET Cell is now accelerating its own efforts to institute an admission system that is fully secure and transparent.

CAT 2025 Admit Card Released – Download Now from **Official Website**

CLAT 2026 Application Correction Window Opens; Aspirants Can Edit Forms Until November 2

The initiative is designed to ensure more equitable preparation opportunities, particularly for students from government schools, rural backgrounds, and economically disadvantaged sections who may not have access to coaching institutes or paid online test series. With CUET now being the gateway to admissions in central universities, many state universities, and private higher-education institutions, the launch of a structured practice ecosystem is expected to benefit lakhs of students across India

Beyond CUET-UG, NTA has also announced plans to extend similar mock-test support to candidates preparing for JEE Main, NEET-UG, and other national-level entrance exams.

The long-term roadmap includes developing a unified practice platform, AI-driven performance analytics, and topic-wise feedback systems to help students assess their level and strengthen weak areas. Education experts and school counsellors have welcomed the move, calling it a "major step in democratising entrance exam preparation" and reducing psychological stress associated with high-stakes testing.

Students are encouraged to regularly attempt the mocks, track progress, revise topic-wise concepts, and practice time-bound strategies to maximise performance. With competitive exams becoming more skill-oriented and less rote-driven, the rollout of this digital testing support system marks a student-friendly shift in India's entrance examination ecosystem.

CSIR UGC NET December 2025: Application Correction Window Opens for Candidates

The National Testing Agency (NTA) has officially opened the application correction window for the Joint CSIR UGC NET December 2025 examination. This facility allows registered candidates to review and make corrections to their submitted application forms. The correction process is available from October 30 to November 1, 2025, through the official NTA website: csirnet.nta.ac.in.

The correction window is an important opportunity for aspirants to rectify any mistakes made during the registration process. Applicants can modify specific fields such as name, parent's name, date of birth, gender, category, sub-category, photograph, signature, and academic qualifications. Candidates are strongly advised to carefully verify every section before final submission, as no further changes will be entertained once the window closes.

The CSIR UGC NET (Council of Scientific and Industrial Research – University Grants Commission National Eligibility Test) is conducted to determine the eligibility of Indian nationals for the award of Junior Research Fellowship (JRF) and for Lectureship (LS)/Assistant Professorship in Indian universities and colleges. The December 2025 session of the examination is scheduled to be held on December 18, 2025.

Several practical elements including activity sheets, industry case studies, real-life business examples, project-based learning, and analytical exercises have been integrated to encourage critical thinking and experiential learning.

Teachers will be provided orientation support and structured teaching guides to ensure smooth adoption of the new content. Schools are also being encouraged to host commerce clubs, student business fairs, and financial awareness sessions to further strengthen learning outcomes.

Education experts have welcomed the update, stating that the revised modules will equip students with essential life and career skills, improve performance in competitive exams such as CUET, and prepare them for higher studies in business, finance, and With India's economics. economy rapidly modernizing, this move is seen as a timely step nurturing financially toward entrepreneurial, aware, globally-competitive learners.



MHT CET 2025: Complete Overview

The Maharashtra Common Entrance Test (MHT CET 2025), conducted by the State Common Entrance Test Cell, Maharashtra, is a state-level entrance exam for admission into undergraduate programs in Engineering, Pharmacy, and Agriculture across Maharashtra. It acts as a key admission gateway to reputed institutions such as COEP Technological University (Pune), VJTI Mumbai, SPIT Mumbai, and MIT-WPU Pune. For admission into Engineering, PCM (Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics) is mandatory, while for Pharmacy, PCB (Physics, Chemistry, Biology) is required. Students must secure at least 45% marks (40% for reserved category candidates from Maharashtra). There is no age limit for appearing in the exam.

Registration Dates: The online application process for MHT CET 2025 is expected to begin in January 2025 and continue till March 2025. Candidates can apply online at cetcell.mahacet.org. The Computer-Based Test (CBT) will likely be conducted in April–May 2025, with separate sessions for PCM and PCB groups.

Exam Pattern: The MHT CET 2025 is held in online mode and comprises multiplechoice questions (MCQs). The PCM group paper consists of Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics, while the PCB group includes Physics, Chemistry, and Biology. Each paper carries 100 marks, with a total duration of 90 minutes per subject group. The difficulty level is on par with JEE Main for PCM and NEET for PCB. Physics and Chemistry questions are based on the Class 11 and 12 Maharashtra State Board syllabus, emphasizing conceptual understanding and application.

Syllabus: The syllabus is drawn primarily from Maharashtra State Board Class 11 and 12 textbooks, covering topics such as Mechanics, Thermodynamics, Organic Chemistry, Calculus, Algebra, Reproduction, Genetics, and Human Physiology, depending on the stream (PCM/PCB).

The National Defence Academy (NDA)

Examination 2025, conducted by the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC), is a national-level entrance test for candidates aspiring to join the Indian Army, Navy, or Air Force as officers. Eligibility: For NDA 1 and NDA 2 2025, candidates must be unmarried male or female students who have passed or are appearing in Class 12. To join the Air Force and Navy wings, candidates must have studied Physics and Mathematics at the 10+2 level, while for the Army wing, any stream is acceptable. The age limit is 16.5 to 19.5 years, and candidates must meet strict medical and physical fitness standards set by the armed forces.

Registration Dates: UPSC conducts the NDA exam twice a year NDA I in April 2025 and NDA II in September 2025. Registration for NDA I 2025 is expected to open in December 2024 and close in January 2025, while NDA II 2025 applications will likely begin in May 2025. Applications can be submitted online at upsc.gov.in.

Exam Format: The NDA written exam comprises two papers — Mathematics (300 marks) and General Ability Test (GAT – 600 marks), totaling 900 marks. The GAT section evaluates English proficiency, general knowledge, and current affairs. On successful completion, cadets are commissioned as Lieutenants, Sub-Lieutenants, or Flying Officers.

Conducting Authority: The Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) conducts the NDA exam under the supervision of the Ministry of Defence, Government of India.



Exam Pattern: The IAT is a 3-hour online test comprising 60 multiple-choice questions (MCQs) 15 questions each from Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, and Biology. The Birla Institute of Technology and Science Admission Test (BITSAT) 2025, conducted by BITS Pilani, is a national-level entrance exam for admission to Integrated First-Degree Programs (B.E., B.Pharm, and M.Sc.) offered across BITS campuses in Pilani, Goa, and Hyderabad. Known for its academic excellence and industry-driven curriculum, BITSAT is one of India's most prestigious private engineering entrance tests, attracting thousands of aspirants each year.

Eligibility: Candidates must have passed or be appearing in Class 12 (or equivalent) in 2024 or 2025, with Physics, Chemistry, and Mathematics as compulsory subjects for B.E. programs, and Biology instead of Mathematics for B.Pharm. Florida Governor Bans H-1B Hiring in State Universities, Impacting Indian Professionals

In a controversial move that has sparked criticism from global talent communities, Florida Governor Ron DeSantis has ordered all state universities to stop hiring employees on H-1B work visas, a decision that effectively ends opportunities for many skilled foreign professionals including a large number of qualified Indians seeking academic and research positions in the U.S.

DeSantis stated that universities should "hire Americans first," higher education accusing institutions across the country of "importing foreign workers on H-1B visas instead of employing qualified American citizens." The directive is framed as an effort to curb alleged misuse of the visa system, but experts warn that it could unfairly target international scholars, researchers, professionals, many of whom have contributed significantly to U.S. innovation and education.

The move has caused deep concern among the Indian academic and professional community, who represent one of the largest groups of H-1B visa holders in the U.S. Thousands of Indian scholars have long relied on the visa to work in American universities and research centers, contributing to groundbreaking research, **STEM** innovation, and teaching excellence. Many now fear that this decision could limit diversity, slow down collaborative research, and push talented minds away from the U.S. to more welcoming countries such as Canada, the U.K., or Australia.

Education analysts have described the ban as "short-sighted," warning that such policies risk undermining America's long-standing reputation as a global education leader. For Indian academics and researchers who have spent years striving for global opportunities, the new order represents yet another setback in an increasingly restrictive immigration climate.
